

CROP DIVERSIFICATION PROGRAM IN MEGA-LIFT IRRIGATION PROJECTS (CDP-MLIPS):

Cooking competition and food demonstration	3 non-paddy food cooking competitions were organized with a total of 253 participants included farmers, members and leaders of self-help groups and CBOs. BAO, AAO, AO, VAW, BPM-Odisha Livelihood Mission, along with Sarapancha and social workers, were present as resource persons and facilitated this session on revitalizing the cultivation of indigenous, climate-resilient food crops like pulses and millet and increasing farmers income from pulses and millets and promoting and convincing the community for non-paddy crop demonstration and contribution.
Road Show on Crop Diversification	A two-day road show was conducted raise awareness about the crop diversification programme and long-term visions for non-paddy cultivation. The Road Show was organized with a team of recognized cultural actors who travelled to all the ten villages and through Daskathia (local folk) they convinced farmers, SHG groups, and community leaders/influencers for non-paddy crop, and its contribution to sustainable agriculture practices, exchanging knowledge with all villagers, to become more sustainable and move towards brand awareness of non-paddy crops.
District Level Felicitation Ceremony	The programme was conducted on the 8 th of March 2022 at the Seba Jagat campus in Burat. A total of 75 progressive farmers, CBOs, SHG members, PRI members, and NGO representatives, along with villagers attended this programme. Mr. Bhupindra Sing, Honorable MLA, Narla Constituency, Kalahandi, Mr Puspendra Singhdeo (Chairperson Zilla Parisad, Kalahandi) along with eminent Social workers, PRI leaders participated. On this occasion, they felicitated 15 progressive farmers/CBOs for their effort in promoting non paddy agriculture. Along with raising awareness on importance of non paddy agriculture a sapling was also gifted to each participants.

ADDRESSING DISTRESS MIGRATION IN MIGRATION PRONE BLOCK

With the objective of arresting distress migration, ensuring poor people's livelihood opportunities by providing employment opportunities, a partnership between the Kalahandi and Nuapada District administration and Seba Jagat was developed for 25 panchayats. The programme also aimed at Developing productive assets while decreasing disasters and migration Proper management of natural resources can foster social equality by empowering rural women and to initiate a people-oriented planning



manage and govern their Commons; facilitate tenure rights & FRA 2006 .Village communities over the commons and facilitate in preparation of CFR claims and restoration plan and get those plans implemented through securing funds from Government Programmes such as MGNREGA.

1. **Project Goal:** The Forest Rights Act (FRA), 2006 recognizes the rights of the forest dwelling tribal communities and other traditional forest dwellers to forest resources, on which these communities were dependent for a variety of needs, including livelihood, habitation and other sociocultural needs.

2. Objective of the Project:

To ensure land tenure, livelihood, and food security for the forest-dwelling Scheduled Tribes and other traditional forest dwellers. It empowers communities to use, manage, and govern forests for their own benefit as well as for forest conservation and protection. So that tribal and forest dwellers' community rights over the forest land in which they live are dependent and allow them to claim compensation.

Activities accomplished Status:

- Organizing awareness programmes and trainings at 100 Villages shared the information on Commons, Forest Rights Act (FRA) and CFR, Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA) and related subjects/ issues.
- Assisted the Village level plan at 100 villages and celebrated the world environment day at 5 villages, 10World Water Day, 3 World Commons Week, Children's Day at Gochhadengen GP level etc
- Worked with the 100village level community and evolved to them on rules and regulations and strengthened their institutional system
- Liaison with Panchayats and issue of notices of 200 villages for conducting the Gram Sabha
- Assist the FRCs for prepared of 100 CFR claim documents involving demarcation of traditional boundary and prepared of sketch map, filling up of Forms B and C correctly, collection of evidences, etc.

- Assist Gram Sabha in documentation of proceedings of meetings, writing of letters, notices and other related documents etc.
- Liaison with local forest and revenue officials for verification of 100 CFR claims
- Facilitate the VI to conduct Gram Sabha for consideration and approval of claims
- Ensured submission of 100 CFR claims in SDLC and receipt of acknowledgement from authorized officer/authority
- Prepared and submit monthly reports to the Block Resource Person (BRP).
- Assisted Block Resource Person (BRP) for conducting of trainings and orientations on FRA, MGNREGA and participate in such trainings.
- Any other tasks assigned by FES from time to time based on the requirement
- Organized 100 orientation and training for the CFR Management Committee about preparation
 of restoration plan in the CFR area and other common land and ensure participation of women
 members.

MANAGEMENT OF HEALTH AND WELLNESS CENTRES PHC (N) UNDER PPP MODE OF NHM

Management of Health and Wellness Centers, PHC (New): Seba Jagat has taken the administrative

responsibility to run and manage a Health & Wellness Centre, PHC (new) of Barabandha of M. Rampur Block, Bengaon of Lanjigarh block of Kalahandi district and also Lankagarh PHC of Tumudibandha block in Kandhamal District in private public partnership mode with the support of National Health Mission Odisha. The health and wellness centres (PHC New) are serving people living in the most remote areas of Kalahandi and Kandhamal districts. One MBBS doctor, an Ayush doctor, a pharmacist, an ANM, a laboratory technician, and a ward attendant are appointed by the organisation in each Health and Wellness centre. The OPD is functioning 24 hours a day and on an average, 45 patients are getting treatment



regularly in each center, and many critical patients have been able to survive.

The people from around 38 villages of Barabandha and also the nearest Gram Panchayat, 33 villages of Bengaon GP, 118 villages other nearest GP of Kalahandi District, 36 villages of Lankagarh GP, and also the nearest GP of Kandhamal District depend on this centre for their primary and emergency services.

Barabandha PHC (N) Outdoor Patient Diary (OPD): In this year, a total of 23,301 patients have approached this centreand got treatment. Among them, 9481 no's are male, and 8674 no's are female.

Similarly, 2844 children are male children, and 2302 are female children. **Barabandha PHC (N)**: **AYUSH Outdoor Patient Diary (AYUSH OPD):** In this reported year **7633** no's patients were registered, and have got benifited by our Ayush Doctor. We also provided free Ayurvedic medicines










NUTRITION & EDUCATION PROGRAMME

Seba Jagat ,Kalahandi has a direct response to the problem of malnutrition highlighted in the published Lancer study . The programme focuses on the most effective option of preventing and correcting malnutrition in children through the provision of milk and wellbeing activities to engage in the learning activities to impact their health and wellbeing from 6 months to 6 years with the support of JDF. GoaProvision of daily education and nutrition to malnourished children from 6 months to 5 years in the villages, 6 days a week.

SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY SCIENCE PROGRAMME

The school and community science programme implemented by the supported by of LIVOLINK FOUNDATION under the South Odisha Initiative. The Programme is operational by Seba Jagat in the Lanjigarh Block of Kalahandi district. The core objective of the program is to develop Scientific Temperament by doing hands on science activities among the



2085 students and create awareness in community level through community programme across 09 Gram Panchayat of Lanjigarh Block.

The Mobile Science Van is well equipped with different science instruments and models and is run by a resource centre situated at Musanal. The village of Lanji Gram Panchayat will be served by these vans,

managed by a trained science coordinator and a driver.



The team with the van travels from school to school with hands-on science kits to help the students learn by doing the hands-on scientific experiments. Along with this, the science team visited communities to help them understand science in their everyday lives, like agriculture, health, sanitation, etc. The science programme also works on the eradication of blind beliefs and myths in the minds of people by showing and describing some of the scientific reasons behind such beliefs.

SAMPURNA BARTA – Integrated Community Mobiliation for Child Health Nutrition and Development

Sampurna Barta Project aims to critically supplement the effort of the project Sampurna (State Strategy for Accelerated Reduction of IMR and MMR) which is currently being undertaken by Govt in Selected Districts of Odisha. While sampurna project focuses on strengthening services & health infrastructure the project Sampurna Barta aims to strengthen key players those can play crucial role in community mobilisation and thereby



effectively link services to bring improvement in IMR & MMR by improving primary stakeholders behavior related to health and nutrition

- In order to continue covid appropriate behaviour, WASH practices as well bringing improvement in MHM behaviour 6 capacity building activities for FLWs were conducted with different stakeholders/departmental personnel,
- To sensitise community about child marriage different platforms like SHG, women farmers association, MGNREGS job card holders association, tribal association, FPOs, GKS are used where the negative impacts of early marriage has been discussed.
- The mothers are counselled mostly in the hard to reach area and are going for regular immunisation.
- We are tracking the left out and drop outs and trying to resolve the issues with a joint collaboration of FLWs.
- The no of ANC is increasing owing to more attendance in VHSND

• School Sanjog program had good impact on the children as well as on the community. A majority of children have returned to school.





Process adopted

- The capacity building activity of the project was held in three levels through structured trainings, interactive purposeful/thematic meetings and structured reviews of project staff. At CSO, Block & district level
- Capacity building training for all the staffs was conducted at the time of inception with time to time refresher participatory training
- There was regular review (weekly / fortnightly) by the District authority
- Information updation and knowledge sharing through whatsapp group
- Experience & Peer learning process
- Every month a staff meeting is conducted where we review the previous month activities and plan for next month. The staff meeting gives an opportunity to learn from each others experience and plan for capacity building trainings. Similarly Block level review is one learning platform





- Developing Cadres: The project developed local volunteers and has provided them with training on different aspects of MGNREGS.We have also tried to link them with local government structure which has proven right strategy
- Development and strengthening of Community based organisation :Through the

project we have tried to develop association of job card holders and have tried to equip them with necessary skills and knowledge on different schemes. Similarly we have also identified existing structures like SHG, tribal forums and have tried to link them with the volunteers. These groups with their indigenous knowledge has involved in the village level planning and have planned for NRM based structure

- Building capacities around tangible win: Apart from general training we have tried to give examples of small tangible achievements for further replications We have found when beneficiary realises the benefits they participated more actively
