A.PRIMARY HEALTH

A.1 Health & Wellness Centre, PHC (N), Barabandha

Seba Jagat has taken the administration responsibility to run and ménage a Health & Wellness Centre, PHC (new) under Private Public partnership Programme with the support of National Health Mission Odisha since 12th June-2008 at Barabandha. This PHC is serving to peoplr living one of the most remote area of Kalahandi district. One M.B.B.S Doctor, an Ayush Doctor, a pharmacist, an ANM, a Laboratory technician a Ward Attendant are appointed by the organization to run the center. The people from around 38 villages in Barabandha and also nearest Gram Panchayat are depending on this Centre for their primary and emergency services. The OPD is functioning in 24 hours in a day and on an average 45 patients are getting treatment regularly and many critical patients have been able to survived.



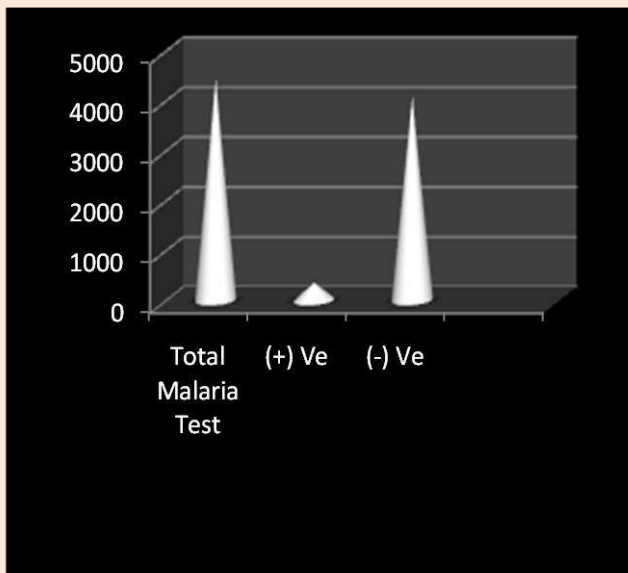

Outdoor Patient Diary (OPD): In this Year all total 20537 no's of patients have approached this centre. And got treatment Among them, 11124no's are male, and 0413 no's are female, Similarly 2704 nos are male children and 2331 no's are female children.

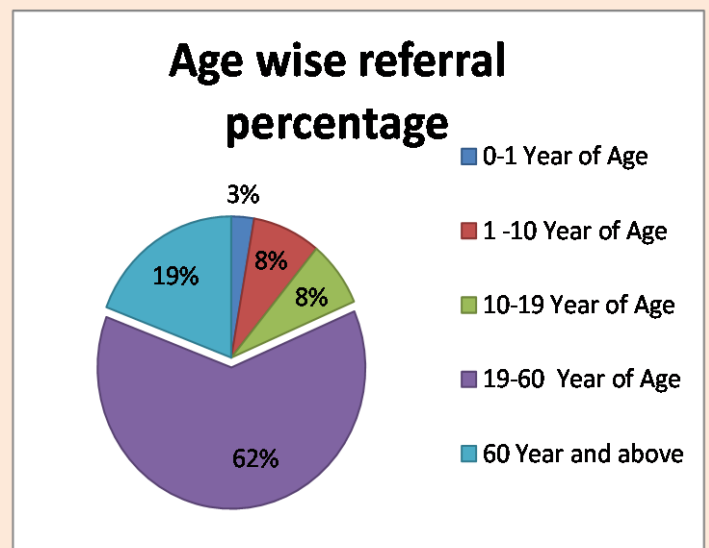

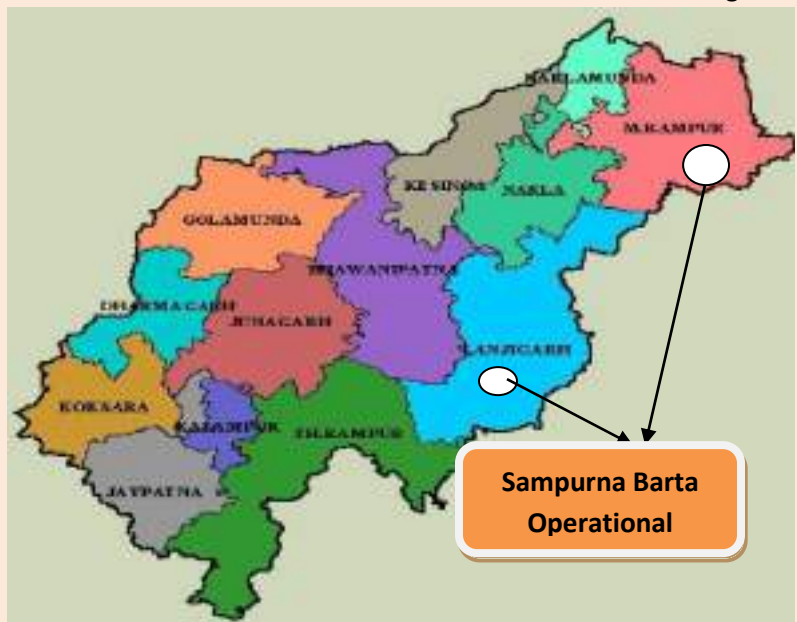
g. Solar System to PHC (New), Barabandha : With the Support from SELCO Foundation,

A.2. Sampurna Barta : It is an Integrated Community Mobilisation Initiative for Improved Access and Demand for Health, Nutrition & Sanitation Services in 36 health sub-centers and 44 most vulnerable gram panchayats of M. Rampur and Lanjigarh block in Kalahandi District . The project has been supported by UNICEF-Odisha. The main objective of the project is to enhance the uptake of health, nutrition and sanitation services among vulnerable communities for improved child survival. It aims to bring improvement in IMR & MMR by bringing paradigm shift in primary stakeholders behavior related to health, nutrition and water sanitation To tap the potential of existing stakeholders and identify the key areas relating to health and Nutrition on which capacity of the individual be improved upon and Create a ground based change agents, multi skilling of front line workers, building capacities of the



stakeholders in transacting lifesaving communication skills as well as equipping community with knowledge on the welfare schemes and entitlements. The main target group of the project is Children (0-5 years) , pregnant/lactating women and households

Achievement:

Out Put 1:Frontline workers (FLWs) of DHFW, DWCD and PRD working in 44 GPs of 2 blocks of Kalahandi have improved capacity to deliver quality government services related to infant and young child health, nutrition, child marriage and sanitation

District Level Training of Trainers : Organized 2 days Residential Training of Trainers at at Bhawanipatna on key health issues, entitlements and schemes in which 40 participants were participated.

Orientation to Formal Health service providers on key health issues and communication : 27 nos. of Orientation to Formal Health service providers (18 program at Lanjigarh and 9 Program at M. Rampur Block) has been conducted on key health issues and communication. The major topics covered were Counseling need of pregnant and lactating mothers, complementary and supplementary needs of children, new born care, institutional delivery, growth monitoring and plotting , learning about danger symptoms of pregnant women, JSY and Mamata Yojana availing, different issues and gaps at the community level, Follow up was taken with those FLWs whom previous training was provided Planning for sector meeting, joint visit to beneficiaries, growth monitoring with mothers, Discussion with community on new born and immunization services, institutional delivery, learning different health related practices and improving on it

Training to project Staff/ Core Staff : 2 days training provided to Staff on handholding and supportive supervision during VHNDs and FIDs was conducted on above said topics along with planning and monitoring

Training to Sanitation Motivators/SEMs on CLTS approaches and Nigrani Committees : Provided one day training in M. Rampur and Lanjigarh blocks. In this training 80 Sanitation Motivators/SEMs re-oriented on CLTS approaches and Nigrani Committees (SHGs) along with orientation to them on using communication tools followed up by Community meeting on CLTS approach Meeting with SHG Members, adolescent girls on CLTS approach, Regular contact with the SEMs and involving them in different programme, community level monitoring of activities

Out Put 2: Community influencers have enhanced knowledge and skill, promote positive health, nutrition, sanitation and hygiene behaviours affecting maternal and child health among communities

Training to Community leaders on key Components on RMNCH : One day GP Level training provided to community leader on RMNCH and covered 318 village level leaders in 8 Training program and orientated to them on key components on RMNCH (GPs) along with correct health behaviors and negative social norms/ cultural barriers with influential persons, traditional healers on early marriage, nutritional need of pregnant, lactating mothers and children, need of immunization, institutional delivery. Their role and responsibility. Obtaining their participation in VHND, Mamta Divas . It was also discussed in the clan meeting of Kondhs and

Gonds to stop early marriage through clan pressure. Ensuring participation of women in clan meeting to have discussion

Training to PRI members on Health : Provided 6 days training to 185 PRI Leaders cum PEO to ensure health monitoring and on different health schemes regarding health seeking behavior at the community level, different types of practices in delivery and new born care, community norms and social practices, issues and challenges, how to improve upon different cultural barriers ,components of RMNCH,

Training to Informal Health Service Provides on Health : 8 days training for informal Health service providers are organized where totally 263 informal service providers Dishari, vaidya, Dhai, Guni participated. The major topics covered were Counseling need of pregnant and lactating mothers, complementary and supplementary needs of children, new born care, institutional delivery, growth monitoring and plotting , learning about danger symptoms of pregnant women, JSY and Mamata Yojana availing, different issues and gaps at the community level,

Meeting with Adolescents on Health and Sanitation : 136 meetings of community level adolescent girls are organized . The major topics discussed were evils of early marriage, sanitation practices during menstrual period, adolescent role in monitoring health seeking behavior as well services Group of adolescent girls are formed, planning for village level meeting, Planning to stop early marriage in their respective village through group as well as awareness of parents

Out Put 3: Families in communities have access to information and counselling to improve the survival and growth of their children and health of mothers

Coordination Meeting with Line Department Official along with the NGOs partners : Organized 3 coordination meeting in Quarterly basic with CDMO, ADMO FW, DSWO, DD DPMU, DPM NHM, ADPHCO, PHEO integrated into IMR/MMR review in the district The quarterly review and sharing meeting with district administration organised jointly by all three partner organisations (ANTODAYA, KARRTABYA and SEBA JAGAT) The project team of all three partner organisations in Kalahandi along with the volunteers participated and shared their experiences; problems faced in the field and sought suggestions from the district officials for the remedial measures.

Light one small candle than to curse the darkness

Marding is one of the remotest tribal village in Urladani Panchayat of M.Rampur block of the Kalahandi district. It is covered with natural forest and hills. The total HH of this village is 76. The village is around 14 kms from Panchayat head quartes and literally cut off in the rainy season. The habitants of the village are Kondh tribals and Dalits mostly habituated with Cultivation, and collection of NTFP. The village was loaded with almost all the problems like home delivery, lack of nutrition and immunization. The practices regarding health and sanitation was also very poor.

The Sampurna Barta Programme with the support of UNICEF by Seba Jagat initiated several sensitization programs in the village related to child care, institutional delivery, ANC/PNC, immunization, nutrition etc and others. This included small group meeting, individual counseling, village meeting, FFL video show.

Though initially people did not show any interest but slowly few young people understood the problem and they started showing the interest. One among them was Tarenga Majhi, a young energetic person who understood the problem and showed interest to change the village scenario.

It was found that the due list is 17 for immunization. The volunteer as well the Tarenga who became the influential person of the village planned to cover all children and pregnant women for immunization. There was a series of counseling to mothers as well to pregnant women. On due date all were present but 3 pregnant women were not at all agreed to get TT. Even on immunization date they planned to run away to forest. But there was lot of counseling to the women by Tarenga and Sarunga. They also gave example of a particular case where the child died without medication. At last the women agreed to get TT and all the 17 persons got immunized. This happened for the first time that all the persons in due list got immunized. This also encouraged the AWW, ASHA, ANM and other health dept staffs present. They also feel the need to provide good service in the area and the people also think that they need to be present during immunization.

Now the nutrition service in the village has improved. They have also decided not to do early marriage of boys and girls. Bdimbuli a pregnant woman who also got TT says “now onwards I will take my folic acid tablets regularly and will come to the centre.”

The change in Marding surely has the capacity to bring change among many hard to reach villages.

B. EDUCATION-

School and community science programme : The project is being conceived to support the children in selected 18 schools of Lanjigarh block in Kalahandi district of Odisha in their science education. Tata Consultancy Services Ltd has provided the financial support for the project. Tata Trusts is steering the project along with TCS. Eklavya of Housangabad, Madhya Pradesh is provided technical support for the project. The objective of this project is to foster curiosity, creativity and imagination in young minds and inculcate skills such as design mind-set, computational thinking, adaptive learning, physical computing etc. Young children will get a chance to work with tools and equipment to understand what, how and why aspects of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math). As per the design of the project, specially designed Mobile Science Vans has been placed in Lanjigarh block. These vans will be manned by a trained science coordinator and a driver.



The team with the van travel school to school with hands on science kits, to help the students learn by doing the hands on scientific experiments. Along with this the science team visited communities to help them understand science in their everyday life like agriculture, health, sanitation etc. The science programme also work on eradication of blind beliefs and myths in the mind of people by shown and described some scientific reason behind such beliefs.

Some Key Achievement of the Project

- ⇒ Science Van has been moved to 18 targeted schools of the block and exhibited 70 practical session in this schools and completed 10 science project and also 8 science project demonstrated in 46 science classes in which 1623 students got opportunity to participated and exhibited their skill in science activities
- ⇒ 82 video session on Malaria, sanitation (construction and use of Toilet) Mother & Child care , value and use of Napkin and diarrhea in 11 villages in our 5 operational GPs so that,



increased the community health behaviors practices i.e health and sanitation practices and they are concerned to Mother and children on food, nutrition, Immunization and given more priorities for Institutional delivery.

- ⇒ Now the science teacher are started adopting our science kit during classroom transaction
- ⇒ Increased the demand of students for organize the practical session as per the theme.
- ⇒ Increased the demand of Science Van services by neighboring schools of our project area.

C. LIVELIHOOD

C.1 SU POSHAN PROGRAM

The Su Poshan project has been implemented in 25 villages of 5 Gram Panchayats of Lanjigarh block in Kalahandi District. This project has been supported by Indo Global Social Services Society (IGSSS), New Delhi. Overall of the achievements in regards the concerning 4 objectives i.e Incomes of smallholder farmers and landless families have increased through the adoption of diversified and innovative livelihood options. Communities are able to manage their natural resources sustainably. CBOs function as self-sufficient, sustainable and democratic spaces for local political participation in matters of rural livelihood and development. They stand up for the rights of the community members. The nutritional situation has improved, particularly for women and children under the age of five. The range of available food has increased. The Target Group of the program is women and children under 5 years of age, Small & Marginal farmers, CBO & PRI and Front line workers like AWW, ASHA, and ANM

Component wise Major Achievements:

Component -1 : The nutritional situation has improved, particularly for women and children under the age of five. The range of available food has increased

Achievements

Project introductory meeting at Block level: Organized the Block level Project Introductory Meeting at Biswanathpur where 67 participants from ICDS & Health sector, PRI, Small & Marginal farmers, Village leaders were present and could participate actively towards aims and objectives of our project norms and know and learn about what is their role & responsibility in our project

Health camp/screening camp to the identify the SAM/MAM children and anemic women and adolescent girls : 25 no of Screening/ Health camp organized and identified 37 SAM & 285 MAM children and 44 anemic mothers and referral ro them for betterment of their health services. 3 no of SAM children referred to NRC by CBO and their improvement has brought a positive impact in the area.



Awareness of Adolescent girls & Mothers for nutrition diet crops and know the nutrition value of livestock for consumption : Organised 4 nos of awareness programme among 135 Adolescent girl and mothers on nutrition diet crops and know the nutrition value of livestock for consumption.

Orientation to Sanitation Motivators on CLTS approaches and Nigrani Committees: Organized 4 program and orientated to 134 Sanitation on CLTS approaches and Nigrani Committees (SHGs) and also orientated to them about the use of communication tools & Convergence with different state and National schemes for toilet construction.



Exposure visit of Active Women CBOs (Matru Mandal Committee) to NRC : Organized a Exposure in which 15 nos. of selective CBOs,PRI, Matru Mandal Committee & 3 nos of Su Poshan Project staff are exposure visit to NRC, Bhawanipatna, Kalahandi

Impact :

- The adolescent girls have formed their group and have started stopped early marriage at Dandiguda Village of Lanji GP, Pajibahali village of Bengaon GP and Kubri village of Bandhapari GP of Lanjigarh block.
- Towards reduced of water borne diseases at the community level, the re-oriented sanitation motivators on CLTS approaches and Nigrani committee by using communication tools and convergence with different state and national schemes are motivating the beneficiaries to construct toilet & use. Hence so far 130 households could construct toilets & use by them.
- 3 no Of children referred to NRC, Bhawanipatna for their treatments which are followed up by the CBOs in the concerned villages.
- Small and marginal farmers towards increase of their income are practicing their learning in the process of organic

Component -2 : Incomes of smallholder farmers and landless families have increased through the adoption of diversified and innovative livelihood options.

Achievements

- **Capacity building training program among the small & Marginal farmers on promoting organic farm practices & Demonstration of organic fertilizer and Practice:** Organized 4 nos. capacity building training with 142 participants. (Male 88 & 54 Female of small & Marginal farmers) on promoting organic farm practices & Demonstration of organic fertilizer and Practice in 4 location of Lanjigarh block.



- **Interface meeting of CBOs, PRIs with different line departments :** Organized 3 nos. of Interface meeting of 121 nos. of participants of CBOs, PRIs with different line departments like ITDA, Agriculture, Horticulture in Gram Panchayats level of Lanjigarh block for get the benefit the different social schemes & services like NFSA/SFA, different pension & the eligible criteria procedures to avail the same.

- **Interface meeting with bankers, Mission shakti and different financial institution for difference enterprising activities:** Conducted 3 nos. of Interface meeting with 101 SHG Leaders and bankers, Mission shakti and different financial institution for difference enterprising activities at Bengaon, Lakhbahali & Bandhapari GP of Lanjigarh Block.



- **Capacity building of landless families in livestock rearing by enhancing their skill & linkage with Govt. PMKVY/Skill Development program & involve in enterprise activities :**

Organized 4 nos. of Capacity building with 138 marginal farmers & landless families in livestock rearing by enhancing their skill & linkage with Govt. PMKVY/Skill Development program & involve in enterprise activities.

Impacts:

- 130 farmers are able to improved their income by the organic farming, organic vegetable cultivation and planning of fruit bearing trees in their waste land in the process and 150 such farmers are interested to start their farming in next agriculture season
- 85 no. of families received social security entitlements like Old age, PWD & Widow with CBO assistance and 120 potential farmers able to get PDS schemes.
- 5 no of SHGs of Dorasarli and Barguda villages of Lakhbahali GP started enterprising activities like Mushroom Cultivation through linkage and convergence with Gram Vikash.
- In convergence with Centurion University 100 potential farmers of our Su-Poshan operational villages links with the training on Improve Agriculture Technology under Pradhan Mantri Koushal Vikash Yojana (PMKVY) and enhanced the benefit @500/- per farmers along with a valid certificate with farmers ID .
- 40 Land less are able to practice their learning in training of animals and involved in enterprise

Component : 3 Communities are able to manage their natural resources sustainably.

Achievements :

- **Formation Village Development Committees (VDC):** 25 nos of Village Development Committee has been formed in Su Poshan project villages.
- Capacity building to CBOs on developing context specific resilient micro plan and its implementation through convergence: Organised 4 nos of Capacity building training with 125 CBOs leaders at Talbora.Dandiguda , Bandhapari & Bengaon villages of Lanjigarh block on developing context specific resilient micro plan and its implementation through convergence



Impacts

- VDC members are clear about their role and responsibility and Organized their monthly meeting regularly and also developed their village plan accordingly as per the village level issue and they are keeping the interaction with different line department and minimized some of the issues.
- 22 village Level Micro Plan Committees of the Lanjigarh block were sensitized and focus on plantation in common land with the variety of first growing plants, valuable timber plants, fodder for pet animals and any other useful fruit bearing plants. Protection of existing forest area creation of water storage, water conservation through water blockage. Crop and vegetable cultivation with organic & green manure, reduction of use in chemical fertilizer and pesticide which is harmful for each living animals including human beings and environment will be cleaned which is very useful for all.

Components-4 : CBOs function as self-sufficient, sustainable and democratic spaces for local political participation in matters of rural livelihood and development. They stand up for the rights of the community members.

Achievement:

- **Orientation of CBOs, SHG members on management of common property resources and habitats :** Conducted 4 nos. of Orientation programme among 220 CBOs, SHG members on management of common property resources and habitats) to enhance livelihood and protect the natural calamities like drought & flood
- **Orientation of CBOs to participate properly in the local self-Governance planning systems and resource mobilization :** Organised 3 nos. of Orientation program at Pajibahali, Kendugua and Talbora village of Lanjigarh Block in which 101 CBOs leaders were participated



and enhanced the knowledge on local self-Governance planning systems and different channels of resource mobilization through convergence & to know the role and responsibility of vigilance committee.

Impacts :

- The CBOS owned 220 hectars (88 acres) of degraded land that has been identified by them through conducting meeting with the community. 200 percolation tank(size=1'x1'x3') have prepared at Gramya Jangal Musanal forest through convergence with forest department by the CBOs to save the rain water.
- The VBOs in their concerned area has been already identified the 110 functional and non functional water bodies and planned to recharge and requirement of nonfunctional water bodies with available convergence programmes. So far 3 water bodies renovated and used the water in cultivation by the community during Sept to October while the rainfall began for slow.
- CBO & PRI involvement in a constructive way is distribution of supplementary food by AWC at Bandhapari GP
- Increased the Participation of CBOs in VHND session , Gram Sabha meeting and village level planning meeting for all round development of their own village and visualized that 10 CBOs has disposed waste water from their water logging area by means of drainage, soak pit

Case study

The activity of today and the assurance of tomorrow

Village 'Dorasarli ' is situated in Lakhbahali Gram Panchayat of Lanjigarh Block in Kalahandi District of Odisha. The habitants of the village are Kondh tribals and Sundhis along with few Dalit families .The people mostly do cultivation, and collection of NTFP. . Like others Chandra also works in the field in agriculture or in collection and selling of Non timber forest produces.

Through Suposhan programme with the support of IGSSS , Seba Jagat initiated several sensitization programs



in the village related to child care, importance of colostrum and breast feeding, ANC/PNC and others. Chandra attended many meetings. In due period Chandra delivered a baby girl in the hospital who was named Labanya. But

Labanya remained weak and Chandra remained worried . In spite of Chandra 's care there was no improvement rather her health was deteriorating. The AWW ,ASHA and CBO leaders counselled her a lot to both In the Mamta Divas and home visit to take the child to NRC but she was not convinced. But after though initially reluctantly but she was convinced after a series of discussion. The child's weight was as low as 3.87. She took the child to NRC and after 15 days the child's weight was 4.49 kg. She is very happy with her child's growth and started taking care of the child properly as per counseling and now she has become the guide for other mothers.

Case study-2

"Improve income through Organic Farming"

Paikbori is the one among the village of Kankutru GP under Lanjigarh Block of kalahandi district, odisha having 122 families. The main occupation of the villagers is agriculture. Additionally they depend on daily wages & collecting minor forest produces, selling directly or selling after processing and value addition of the products. In this area is irrigation facilities are available but the farmers are not tried for the cultivation of crops in Rabi season. After from that they do not have known how/ technique on crop production at Rabi season. Hence they maintain their life in measurable conditions.

Looking this kind of problem, towards improvement of income of farmers, Seba Jagat, the advanced Non-Govt. organization under Su Poshan project has taken up the responsibilities to link the farmers with agriculture department on the purpose of the land leveling, improve the soil fertility, organic farming, availing training facilities to improve their skill on agriculture, procurement of seed etc. towards better learning.

On behalf of Su Poshan project, we have conducted capacity building training for farmers where 65 selective farmers were participated. Among them 45 farmers were engaged in vegetable cultivation applying their learning from the training during last Rabi crop season by using the water of diversion base facilities. We observed that the farmers cultivated Tomato, Brinjal, Onion, Chilly, Culy flowers etc & produced a lot which has been consumed by them and sold the excess vegetable in the weekly market to improve their income from agriculture.



While our project staff interacted with the above farmers, they came to know that on an average each farmer has earned up to Rs. 2500-3000/- in Rabi season which improves their income and strengthens their livelihood.

Looking at the progress of 45 farmers, other nearby farmers have shown their interest to involve in vegetable cultivation in the coming year and from now they have planned for preparation of vermin compost, handi khata etc which will be used in organic cultivation of crops & vegetables to get better cropping and improve their income towards their better livelihood.



D. Krishi Udyog Sahayak (KUS) Atal Program :

Seba Jagat has been identified the **1500** candidates for the agriculture training as per job role will the criteria and send the candidates database to Gram Tarang through Google sheet shared by Gram Tarang . Gram Tarang also upload all the candidates details under Student database management system and they are provided the list of eligibility of candidates for the training. During this period we have completed the **20** batches agriculture training (each batch 10 days training) on Pulses cultivation and Organic grower at Kalahandi District with the support of Gram Tarang by a Sector Skill Council certified trainer and also given a bag, notebook, Apron. Cap with the detailed course curriculum, training delivery plan, trainer manual, flipcharts & biometric device to each trainer as per the project guidelines. And the Attendance Tracking had done on daily basis in biometric device. Daily photo of the theory class & practical class with entire batch has taken & saved on google drive. Finally by end of the training assessment of the farmers also complied by the Assessment Agency appointed by Gram Tarang.

E. Infrastructure for Climate Resilience Growth (ICRG)

SEBA JAGAT in partnership with IPE Global, DFID and Govt. of Odisha has started pilot programme on Infrastructure for Climate Resilience Growth (ICRG) in Kalahandi district particularly in 6 Blocks i.e. Narla, Golamunda, Kesinga, Lanjigarh, Bhawanipatna & Karlamunda. This basic objective of the community consultation to draw the affects of climate change to various communities like tribal, migrants, agriculture laborers, small and marginal farmers, women headed, vulnerable group, people in general and to prepare a long term strategy to overcome the affect of climate change and cope

Major Activities and Achievement

- 30 no of Climate Resilience work (CRW) Started in Kalahandi District.
- 30 no of CRW Work code are generated in Kalahandi Infrastructure for Climate Resilience Growth (ICRG) area.
- 24 no's of new CRW selected for FY 2019-20
- 24 no's of CRWs Technical and Financial sanction (TS/FS) submitted to DRDA for DPC approval.
- 51 no of integrated work approved.
- 53 CRW work approved by District Project Coordinator. .
- 394 nos. of Technical and Financial sanction (TS/FS) approved.
- 55 no of work code generated.
- **49village** level meeting were organized for ICRG beneficiaries.
- 49 Gram Panchayats Meeting regularly attended by our project staff and Shared about the ICRG project i.e.Its implementation plan, success and linkages with others agency.

- 45 SHGs leaders from ICRG project villages are participated in community level planning meeting and training program and shared the view for properly implementation of the program
- Conducted the 2nd phase Environment assessment /water level survey with the support and participation of communities leaders
- Promoted Kitchen Garden in-33 % HHs level by the farmers orientation and support in ICRG Project villages
- 359 farmers are directly involved in convergence program i.e Pulses, ground nuts and vegetable activities and trained them on Individual Waste management system with the support of Agriculture Dept.
- Participated GP level planning of works on preparation of Labor budget and more priorities on NRM activities and also approved 49 activities in Palli Sabha and Gram Sabha Meeting as per the norms of 60-40 ratio.
- 49 village level planning on labor budget has been prepared by using Kunji Game in 6 blocks
- Attended 49 Palli Sabha and 24 Grama Sabha meeting and developed labour Budget in 6 blocks
- Provided groundnut, Watermelon Vegetables, and sunflower seeds, and Mango Plants to 359--of farmers of ICRG Block linked with Agri. Dept.
- Around 200 farmers are got the Agriculture Training i.e Pulses and Vegetables cultivation with the convergence of ATAL program.

Community Resilience work (CRW) and its benefit

Jamunabahal village is situated in 12 km distance from Bhawanipatana block in Kalahandi District. The villagers of Jamunabahal depend on agriculture and daily wamework to maintain their livelihood. In this village Seba Jagat ICRG team selected a Climate Resilience project with the support of local villagers, GP official for need based site selection of Tentuli sagar kata for the benefit of **large** scale of farmers and passed the project in Grama Sabha in the Financial Year 2017/18. Regular village level meeting organized by Seba Jagat staff on NRM activities, 100day work for a job card holder, Climate Resilience work, so the villagers were interested to involve the CRW .In this CRW project 52 unskilled labour engaged the project work and maintain their livelihood. The payment also credited in their account on timely. In the command area of Tentuli Sagar Kata 10 farmers selected for Land development Mr. Rajendra Bhoi and his family members engaged in CRW works and got Rs 25000/- and invest the some money for Paddy and cotton cultivation. Mr. Rajendra also got land development as one command area farmer through ICRG project, He buy 02 Ox from getting money through MGNREGA, Mr.Rajebdra appreciated ICRG team to get this opportunity to engage in CRW under NREGA.

SKILL TRAINING PROGRAM FOR RURAL YOUTH:

A total of 120 dropout youth (Male- 98 and Female -22) were equipped with vocational skill such as, Driving, House wiring and Electrical appliance. Two Wheelers Mechanics. Mason. Carpentry and Mushroom Cultivations in 4 GPs of M. Rampur block , 1 GP of Narla block in Kalahandi district and 1 GP of Baliguda block in Kandhamal district. Out of 120 trainees 26 male got employed and 31 male 22 female become self employed in this period. In order to support the trainees we have chalked out follow-up plan towards placement, bank linkages for employment / self employment, marketing of products.

Entrepreneurship Development Programme (EDP): 88 male and 22 female youth trainees were capacitated on Entrepreneurship Development program. This is the part of their training courses with an aim to enable and empower them so that they themselves can take up the responsibility of their business plan, fund rising, financial arrangement plan along with entrepreneur norms as well as strengthening their attitude, behaviours with the costumers and also capacitated on different themes such as gender sensitization, HIV/AIDS awareness etc.

Skill Development Team (SDT) : A skill development team has been established at block level by Seba Jagat where 7 male and 4 female are selected by Skill development committee of different GPs. The committee performing their work effectively i.e selection of trade, Trainees and master trainers, information to trainees about local employment linkages with line department for employment of different trade wise trainees, monitoring and supervision to different trade.

Skill Net Group : Seba Jagat working with 13 skill net groups of M. Rampur block . In this community based structure total 60 male and 80 female are associated in this association. The purpose of this forum is to increase the living condition / social status of unskilled workers, properly capital investment of human resources, develop own training mechanisms accessible to the communities , Raise the voice to demand and successfully implementation of different intervention of skill development program along with better employment, payments , access and control over various resources and opportunities

Key Outcome / Impact

- ⇒ 79 of Youth Increased their living condition / Social status
- ⇒ Total capital investment by skill net groups is Rs. 1,84,650.00
- ⇒ Developed own training mechanisms i.e Electrical & Vegetable Framing in their are with accessible to the communities
- ⇒ 226 Youths obtained better employment including old trainee's

CARPENTRY CHANGED THE LIVING STYLE OF A RURAL YOUTH

Kutrupala is one of the forest village of Singhpur Gram panchayat in kalahandi District where Tikechan Patra living with wife, two son



and daughter. In earlier Tikechan was working as a dally wage laborer and earning 100 rupees per day. He was dropped from class 7th due to poor financial condition and engaged in domestic work of his family. Last year he was migrated to Andrapradesh and engaged as a wage labour in construction of Building. After 6 months he was returned to house due to some of health problem.

Previously Tikechan was more interested to do some wood work so after return from Andhapradesh he was made some table, chair, door and window etc but he was not making finessing materials. Tikechan has more hope to become a carpenter but he does not get any scope in their locality.

In between Seba Jagat promote the skill training program for rural youth in same area through SCOPE model approach with the support of FVTRS, Bangalore. So Tikechan was selected through SDC and SDT for the 2 months Carpentry Training. Seba Jagat has provided the instrument for this training along with some training materials and instructor.



Due to interested he was easily capture the instruction of his master Mr. Shyama Ghana Patra. During the training period he was made 15 verities of wooden materials. He has successfully completed the 2 months training program by the proper instruction and handholding support of master trainer as well as proper monitoring, supervision and encouragement of SDT, community and project people.

Now Tickechan Patra is independently handing the carpentry work and able to making verities of wooden materials i.e Bed, Chair, Table, Box, Window, Door and Godrej etc. He has engaged one person for helping in their work. Tikechan is now able to earning Rs.8000/- to 10000/-in monthly basic. He is now able to fulfill the basic need of family and child education.

Community Forest Rights (CFR) : CFR claimed and CFR Management in 1000 villages in Odisha with the partnership of 12 FoGGO network partners i.e SAMONAYA, Seva Bharati and DEVOTE Trust of Kandhamal district, Gram Bharati and JGBA of Nayagarh, SAKTI of Rayagada, IWD of Gajapati, YAR of Nuapada, MASS of Sambalpur, SERVICE of Koraput, LVP of Sundargarh, JKS of Kalahandi District in Odisha. The main objectives of this collaboration are Facilitate secure tenure over Com mon lands and water bodies through effective implementation of Community Forest Rights(CFR)/ restoration of Revenue wastelands/Grazing lands. Strengthen capacities of village communities in preparation and implementation of conservation, restoration and management plans for sustainable management of common land and water bodies. Enable convergence with government programmes like MGNREGA and NRLM for restoration of degraded lands and water bodies and improved livelihoods of rural poor Facilitate use of GIS enabled technologies and tools for informed decision making in restoration planning and action”

Major Achievements of the Network.

- 672 CFR Claim has been submitted to Sub Divisional Level Committees in 8 Districts With in 9,142.33 Acres Forest and Revenue land.
- Provided Capacity building to 1400 Forest Rights Committee towards Forest rights Act-2006.

- 100 GPS Mapping has been prepared in 8 Districts
- 300 Cedars has been trained towards mobile App for CLART,COMMON mapping tools .

- 30 no of Commons programme organized and awareness create to people about commons resource like water,land forest,air etc.

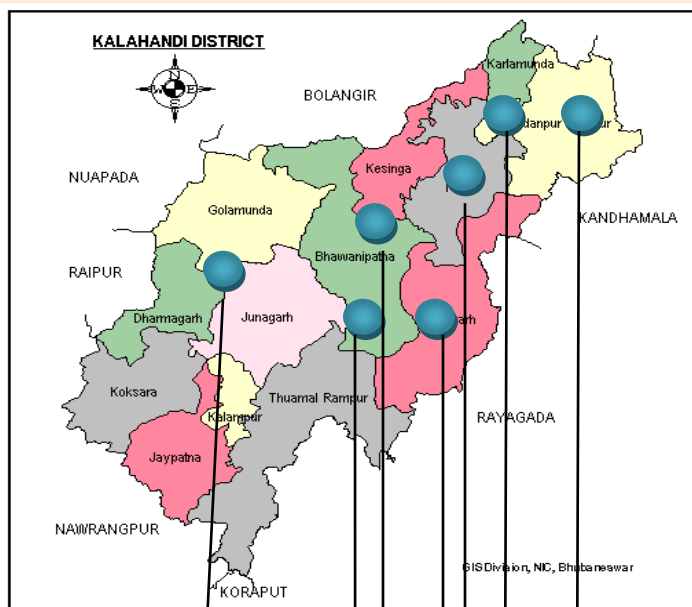
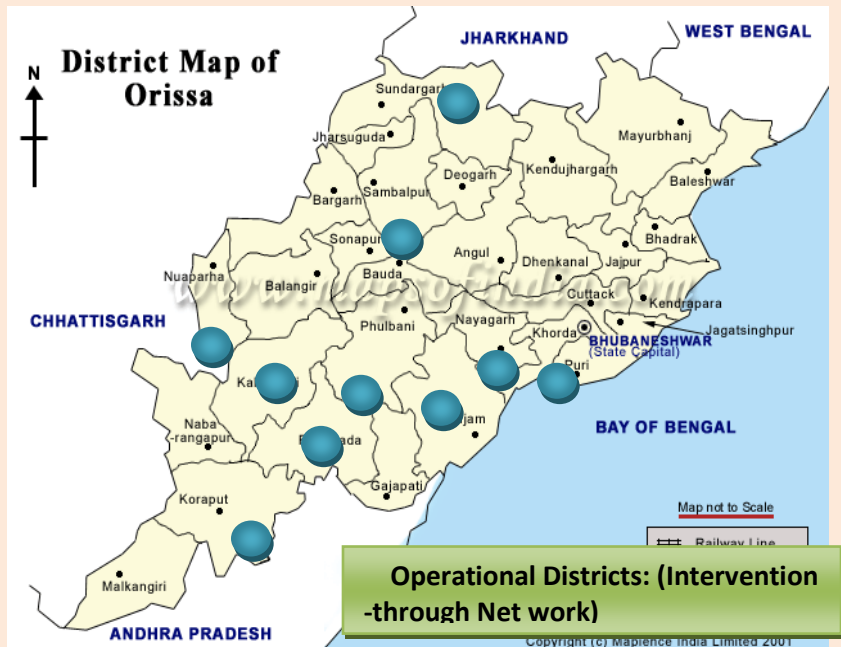

OPERATIONAL AREA AND COVERAGE

The operational area of Seba Jagat is located at the southern western, the most backward region, of Odisha. It covers three districts, Viz, Kalahandi, Nuapada and Kandhamal. At present, Seba Jagat is working in 6 Blocks i.e. M.Rampur, Lanjigarh, Narla and Golamunda of Kalahandi Districts, Boden block of Nuapada District and Baliguda Block of Kandhamal District of Orissa State and Indirect intervention in 9 Districts in Odisha with the Forum of Green Governance of odisha

The Head Office of Seba Jagat M. Rampur is 378 kms distance from state capital Bhubaneswar and 55 kms from the district headquarter Bhawanipatna. The cluster office of Seba Jagat is located at Kumarguda (Lakhbahali G.P) & Musanal of Lanjigarh Block, Limser of Golamunda Block, Rangapadar of Urladani GP & Burat of M.Rampur block, Khariar of Nuapada District and Sudra of Baliguda Block in Kandhamal District. It has been covering total 23126 families out which 12215 ST, 4502 SC & 8514 families are belonging to the Other Backward caste under 425 Villages over 37 Gram Panchayat in three Districts. 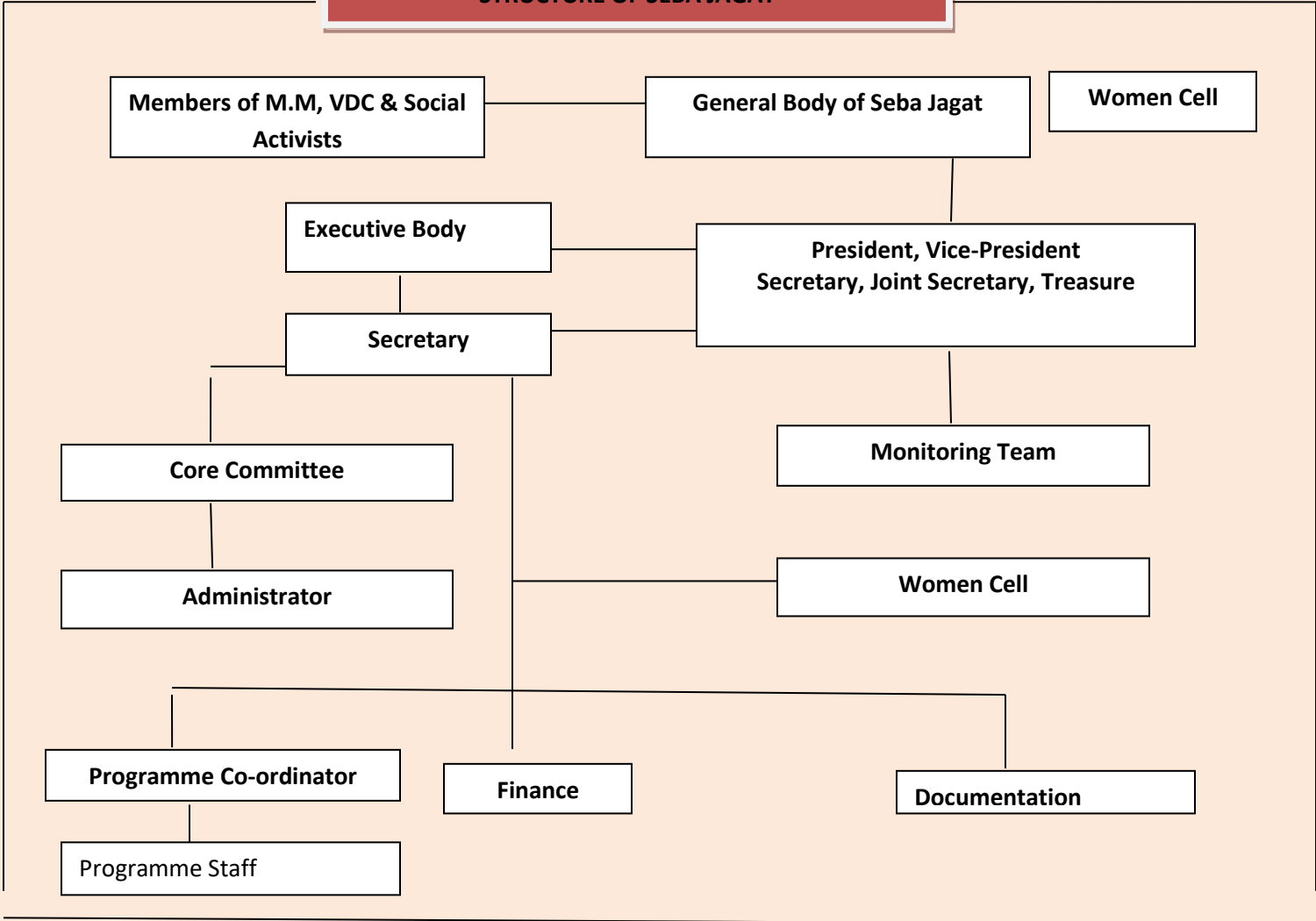
Operational Blocks of Seba Jagat in Kalahandi District
